The scheme brings with it a number of benefits to on trade venues including demonstrating how seriously they take **customer safety, care, and welfare and service quality**. It also helps to enhance working relationships with key agencies such as Police Scotland, the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service and Local Authorities.

The focus for BBN is for consumers to have the ability to choose a safe location where the venues demonstrate a commitment to reducing violence and antisocial behavior, ultimately making Scotland a safer place to live and visit.

Local Priorities

BBN has a local coordinator in each area, where the scheme operates. This coordinator is fundamental and key to the success of the Scheme.

The Local coordinator has knowledge of the local priorities and drives forward the scheme. The coordinator can be a representative from Community Safety Services, BID, Council, Police Scotland or other relevant Partner Agency. The coordinator is often supported locally by ADP, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service and liaises with the local Licensing Forum, LSO, Pubwatch, Nightzone, SLTA representative.

BBN Scotland is nationally administered by the Scottish Business Resilience Centre with support from Funding Partners, Public sector and third party sector.
